Dear friends,

When I was a child in the 60s the Kinks recorded a song with the words "They seek him here, they seek him there ... coz he's a dedicated follower of fashion."

A few years later, as a teenager I was something of a dedicated follower of fashion, from bright orange jeans and flowery shirts to loon pants and tank tops (these were wide legged trousers and a sort of knitted vest, not some kind of underwear and artillery). Now most definitely past all that I am most certainly not a dedicated follower of fashion.

In fact, with a few notable exceptions, I'm not sure that following anything is as fashionable as it used to be. Nowadays we're encouraged to be ourselves, not to follow the crowd but to think for ourselves, which in many ways is a very good thing; it at least saved my daughters from some potential "Dad embarrassment".

So, what are the exceptions, what kinds of following are still around? Well, football supporters still faithfully follow their team, whether it's the blues or the reds or whatever. Political parties and party leaders urge us to support and follow their lead. Tweeters on twitter are invited to follow individuals, being sent the every stray thought and every waking moment of the latest star celebrity.

Twitter asks me to ask myself the question, who it is I want to follow? It's a good question. Do I want to follow the words of a celebrity whose life is utterly removed from mine in their wealth and luxury or someone who understands, and cares about, the ups and downs of my life?

For me the answer to who I want to follow comes in the form of a carpenter called Jesus who knew what it was like to go hungry, who gave his life so that we can know God's love has no limit and who continues to show me a better way of living, even if I don't always manage to follow.

GOOD NEWS

As you are no doubt aware many Christians throughout the world are being persecuted more now than at any other time in history. For example in Pakistan, Christians are not allowed to have well paid jobs, their children are more often than not refused schooling, many Christians face threats and intimidation on a daily basis.

Pastor Kenny his wife Mary and their 4 children are from Pakistan. Kenny is a Vision for Asia Partner. (Vision for Asia, was set up in Braunton almost 20 years ago by Marilyn Collins.)

Following severe persecution and threats to the family Pastor Kenny moved to North Devon last autumn and was seeking asylum, which can often take a period of up to 3 years, sometimes more.

However, the good news is that Kenny and his family have been granted asylum after just six months. Obviously an answer to prayer from many of you here at Christ Church. Kenny wishes to thank everyone for their support, love and prayers.

We are planning an evening Circuit Service on the 23rd July here at Christ Church, and Pastor Kenny has been invited to speak. We hope that many of you will want to come along to that service. - Shirley Baxter

Young Families Work

I went to Hoddesdon for three days to attend a 'Connecting Disciples' conference. This was themed on 'Being the Change' with an emphasis on holiness and justice. I was particularly interested in ideas for creative prayer. There were fourteen prayer stations that could be visited at any time.

One of the prayer stations was entitled 'Sharing the Peace'. Here we were invited to take a cobble stone and write something comforting or uplifting on it. We left these on the table and at the end of the conference these were gathered in and handed out to everyone.

Another prayer station was entitled 'Poverty'. Here you were invited to place one of the paper coins in your hand and think about those that have less than you ... Then put the coin into the money tin.

There was a prayer station with the title 'Our Environment' where you were asked to take an interesting natural item from the table and hold it in your hands for a moment... Then place it into one of the bowls and pray that our leaders will properly consider our earth and its welfare when making political decisions.

Another prayer station was entitled 'Holy Ground'. You had to take a paper flame and write on it a time when you felt especially close to God ... Then you stuck it to the picture of the burning bush and prayed that others will also experience closeness with God.

Creative prayer is an area we are working on developing in Toddler Praise, Sunday Club, X-Site and Holiday Club. We would welcome any ideas you may have.
