Message

Dear Friends,

The further we travel on our journey of faith the more we become aware that our ways are so often not God's ways. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts." (Isaiah 55 vv 8, 9)

So, as we travel the road to Calvary this Lent, it is a suitable time to remind ourselves of the importance of keeping our hearts and minds fixed on God's way ahead, because it is often tempting to decide on a course of action first and then look for divine confirmation. At the start of WWII someone asked a church leader "Do you believe God is with us in this struggle?" to which he replied "I'm rather more concerned that we should be with God."

The distinction between God being with us and us being with God may be a subtle one, but it has a fundamental effect on the closeness of our relationship with God. "I'm taking God into industry" was the proud boast of one industrial chaplain. "How interesting for him, where will you be taking him next?" came the scathing reply.

Perhaps we need to ask ourselves this Lent whether our relationship with God is one in which we allow him to lead us in our actions and on our journey. Our ways may not be God's ways, but we are encouraged to make his ways ours.

The journey to the Cross of Calvary, both in this season and whenever we come face to face with suffering, is a hard road to follow, but we have the example of Jesus Christ to follow and can do so in the knowledge that God will be with us every step of the way. And of course, even when we do get lost on our journey of faith and life, we can know that God will still be with us, ready to bring us back to his way, the way leading to hope, and new life.

Wednesday Feb. 14th - Lent begins with a Circuit Ash Wednesday Service at Bishops Tawton at 7.30pm.

Both groups will use materials from CTBI (Churches Together in Britain and Ireland) based on extracts from the book '**40 Stories of Hope**' (see below). It gives the opportunity to walk with Jesus through Lent, learning from Mark's gospel and from stories of HOPE shared by prisoners, ex-prisoners and chaplains.




Keep our building safe!






Christ Church Family News
