Message

Dear Friends,

On the subject of prayer F Büchner once wrote "At the very least, prayer is talking to yourself. But that's not a bad idea. Talk to yourself about what matters most, because if you don't, you may forget what matters most."

However we understand what is happening when we pray the very least that happens is that it focuses our thoughts and reminds us what we feel is most important at that moment. Take prayer a stage further, as we open ourselves to the subject of our prayer still further and begin to listen we find we may not just be reminded of what is important but may discover, through our praying, a deeper understanding. And taking a gentle step at a time we may well find that our focusing and our listening may lead us to act, becoming part of God's answer to our prayers.

Another, more dynamic image of prayer is given by Peter Graystone who wrote "In my worst nightmare I am walking home from the shops, and as I turn the corner I see to my horror that my flat is on fire. I reach down into my dressing gown pocket ... and from it I take a water pistol. Frantically I start squirting little dribbles into the furnace which has now engulfed the whole block. Then from behind me I hear the familiar siren of a fire engine, and before I know what is going on, a mighty torrent of water hurtles over my shoulder. It gathers up all the pathetic droplets from my water pistol and thunders them with awesome force straight into the heart of the fire. That is what the Holy Spirit is doing with my words and thoughts when I begin to pray."

I don't know about you but I find that's a helpful image to me because sometimes my prayers can seem all too pathetic, lacking in power, ineffective. Especially when praying for the big things like war and famine.

Another powerful picture is of the church family joining together in prayer. If you are new to Christ Church you may not be aware that at 9.30am for around half an hour on most Tuesday mornings people gather in the Chapel for prayer. If you are able to come along and take part please do. Alternatively, if you are unable to come along but wish to take part, put the date and time in your diary and join your prayers with those of others.

When we pray, God hears, and God will answer.

Arlington Court Sponsored Walk

On Saturday 23rd June 2018, we are inviting people to do a sponsored walk around the grounds of the beautiful National Trust Property at Arlington Court.

Christian Aid have been telling the stories of people displaced by earthquakes and hurricanes in Haiti during Christian Aid Week and money raised from the walk will help internally displaced people all around the world. People like Vilia, who was left homeless by the earthquake in 2010. As she walked the streets following the disaster, she no longer recognised her home or neighbourhood, and was surrounded by falling wires and crumbling houses. Devastatingly, she never found her mother.

Bereaved and homeless, life became a struggle. She didn't even have a safe place to sleep.

Christian Aid's partner, KORAL, helps local people prepare for disasters. In the aftermath of the earthquake, they reached out to Vilia and built her and her

family a new home, that was safe, stable and strong enough to stand up to natural disasters. When Hurricane Matthew struck Haiti in 2016, Vilia's new home became a safe haven for 54 of her neighbours.

Christian Aid wants to build more houses for families like Vilia's, to provide them with a safe place to weather the next disaster.

Just £25 could buy a hygiene kit to prevent disease after a disaster and £210 could pay to train a local builder in Haiti to build a safe, secure home for families in need.

The walk at Arlington Court will take place between 10.30am and 3.30pm. It is a family event and dogs are also welcome. Walkers will complete laps around the lake of 1.8 miles. There is no entry fee, but we suggest a minimum sponsorship or donation of £20.


Oasis - a service of healing and wholeness



Holiday Club with Lionel and Chris from the Exmoor Mountain Rescue Team was greatly enjoyed. Lionel and his colleague were brilliant with the children, giving them an interactive talk on survival and rescue with wonderful survival resources. 'The Lost Sheep' was our bible story, providing ideas for craft and food activities as well as a fun drama. The 'Footprints in the Sand' poem also played an integral part in the theme, the children understanding that in times of difficulty and stress God is there supporting us. To illustrate this, the children drew around their feet and with their decorated paper footprints laid a pathway to the cross.

Toddler Praise and Parents and Toddlers Visit the Two Bridges Cafe. Some of the families visited the Two Bridges Café last Thursday. They thoroughly enjoyed themselves, the mums sitting round the small table, drinking coffee, eating delicious cake and chatting whilst the children happily played around them. It was obvious also that these families very much wanted to support this initiative. Hopefully the relationship will continue, pointing the way for other church groups to meet together and interact in a similar way.

The Summer Outing is on 6th June to Exmoor Zoo, kindly and efficiently organised as usual by Jov.

Community Stay and Play Drop-in. Our concern now is not about the group closing down but that we are now 'bursting at the seams!' Our numbers have reached an all-time high and new people are still coming. We have now opened up Room 4 as a space for babies and we are using the outdoor Noah's Park area. A big thank you to John Ruhleman for erecting the shelters in Noah's Park, which provide welcome protection both from the elements and the seagulls! We had a visit from Jess Foy – the recently appointed Centre Lead for Barnstaple Action for Children - a week or so ago, who has ideas of introducing new groups in the afternoons when the Alan Finch Room is free. The team would be so happy if Action for Children and Christ Church find this to be possible.

Spring Fair on Saturday 12th May had a children's corner inside the church and a children's clothes sale outside. We raised £65 on our stalls for church funds and also had many welcome conversations.

Café Church – theme of Pentecost on Sunday 13th May. This ran in a similar way to 'Experience Pentecost' with six stations* to visit in groups, the sixth station being the time when we all came together to worship and to hear how the church is continuing to grow around the world. The other stations had a leader telling the relevant part of the Pentecost story and an accompanying activity. (*Waiting, Receiving, Telling, Doing, Sharing, Growing). The afternoon was appreciated and enjoyed by both children and parents alike.

Pentecost Sunday Crèche on Sunday 20th May was run by the Sunday Club team during the Pannier Market Festival Service, alongside the children's corner – and the lost children area!

Yeo Valley School are bringing three classes of children to church on 24th May for our Experience Pentecost Day.

We are hosting the Open the Book Training Morning with Katherine Lyddon on 9th June. Many Open the Book teams across the area have been invited.
