Message

Dear Friends,

When I was a child in the 1960s my parents were members of St George's Presbyterian Church in Southend-on-sea. It was a congregation largely made up of Scots living in that part of Essex as St George's was the closest thing they could find to the Church of Scotland many had grown up in.

So it was that my family, my wife's family and many others with family roots in the cities and hills of Scotland, came to worship at what would later become St George's United Reformed Church. And so it was too that I came to know an elegant gentleman I only ever knew or addressed as "Mr Murray".

Mr Murray must have been in his seventies when I first met him but even at a young age there were things about him that impressed me and that I remember clearly to this day.

The first thing I remember is that he was tall, upright and always extremely smart. With a beautifully pressed suit, stiff white collar and tie and smart black shoes that were polished to perfection and in the winter a smart dark grey wool coat.

The second thing I remember is that he was extremely kind and caring. He would speak to everyone as an equal, including me as a child. I don't remember what profession Mr Murray had before he retired. In a church full of business people, accountants, civil servants and lawyers I have a feeling he may have been a bank manager but whatever it was he had no airs and graces and was genuinely interested in and cared for everyone.

The third thing I remember are some of the conversations my father would have as my mother, sister and I sat in the back of the car, Mr Murray in the front passenger seat as my father drove him home after church.

I'm sure Mr Murray told us lots about his life, his work, his family, but it is the description he gave of serving in a Highland Regiment in the First World War that still stays in my mind.

I must have been about ten years old at the time so this would have been around fifty years after the end of the First World War and now, fifty years later, we come to the centenary of the end of that war and I still remember Mr Murray and his description of living and fighting in a mud caked kilt full of fleas. Actually, Mr Murray said very little about the fighting, just living and surviving were hard enough without spelling out the full horror.

There is no one now alive who fought in the First World War so, although some may feel a hundred years is enough and its now time to stop

remembering and move on, I am glad and grateful to remember Mr Murray and the friends who served with him.

I do not know what regiment Mr Murray was in nor what rank he held but I do have a tiny inkling of the horrors he faced in the honest belief that he was doing his duty and fighting for a better world.

The miracle for me is that he and so many others came through that horror not only with their humanity intact but determined to make a better world. Which in Mr Murray's case meant playing his part in building the Kingdom of God.

As we pause to remember the 100^{th} anniversary of the ending of the First World War we know, as Mr Murray knew all too well 50 years ago, that the peace it brought didn't last. We can also know that God calls each and every one of us to keep on trying, playing our own part in working to build God's Kingdom.

May we never forget.

I am counting almost two months to come to the end of my training but I know I am greatly ready for the life after Kira.

About the trees to plant in my community, I am planning on promoting fruit trees because they will provide fruits to the community but also most of them produce flowers which would be very good for bees.
