As many of you are aware we are setting up a Community Links Project Team, made up of various groups exploring current and possible work with young families, older people and looking to pursue funding for the project.

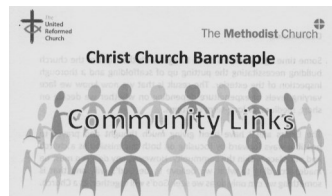

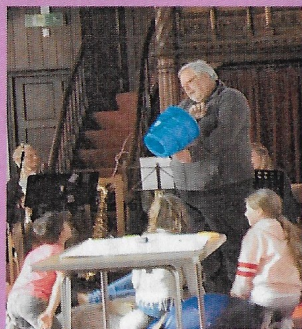

Where do all the shoeboxes go?

Recently, a few of us went to Copplestone to find out about where shoeboxes go when June Redfern and her husband fetch them from Christ Church. June talks about her barn, but we soon discovered that it was part of her home, which is a barn conversion. The boxes, along with blankets and other goods, are stored in her large upper room. There were not many boxes when we visited because the last load had recently been collected, but we saw photos of the barn (room) stacked from floor to ceiling with the goods ready to go to International Aid Trust. Volunteers then use their vehicles to get everything to the lorry – June's home is along a track which is rather bumpy and definitely not suitable for lorries!

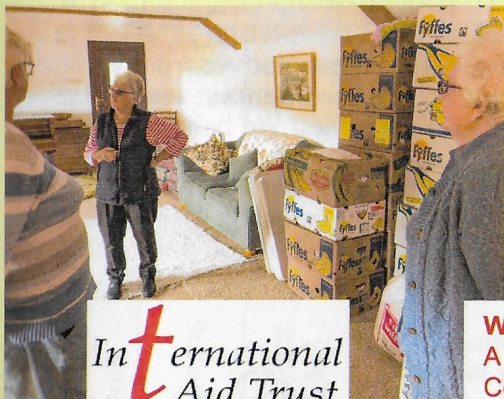
Everything is then taken to a huge warehouse, I think she said it was in Stoke on Trent. We have seen pictures of the racks full of goods when June has shown them as part of her talk to us.

From there, gifts are taken to those in need. The articles in the latest International Aid Trust Update are about India, Ukraine, Moldova and Sierra Leone and there is also mention of support in other countries including the UK. As well as shoebox gifts, the charity organises medical help, orphanage support, self-help projects, church planting, training in tailoring, dispensing of spectacles, food parcels and more than these!

It was wonderful to be welcomed by June and Adrian and to see how much they do for the charity. It was also amazing to hear that they had overseen the conversion from barns to a beautiful home, with Adrian doing all of the woodwork himself. They had a lovely book of photographs to show the stages from "field with barns" to home whilst they lived on site in a mobile home with a second one being used for Adrian to continue his business.

A useful and informative morning out, as well as tasty home made refreshments. Now we all need to support Sylvia by filling up shoeboxes ready for the November collection from Christ Church.

The Experience Easter event went well, at least 500 primary school children were engaged, not including teachers and parents. It is a good witness to the education community to see different churches working together. At least one church has been invited back to a school for a follow up lesson exploring faith.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) – It was reported that the team based at Trinity are looking to grow CAP. They would like to offer x5 days per week appointments. To start a Job Club and to multiply their Release programme for those struggling with addictions.

Foodbank – There is an annual need to improve stock over the summer. Shirley Baxter asked us to pray about provision for school children over the summer.









Street Pastors The team have 4 new pastors – taking the team to 19. In addition another 8 people are observers who may receive training






James (Grosvenor) reported that about 220 attended of which 150 were under 18. 24 young people made first time commitments.
