Café Church

The theme in February was the story of Jesus' Special Friends. The story follows Jesus as he borrows a boat from a fisherman named Peter, to address a large crowd on the bank of a lake. After Jesus' speech, he led Peter out further from the lake's shore and caught a large amount of fish of all different colours. To celebrate this story, we decorated fish shaped biscuits and ornaments to show the variety of fish caught that fateful day. Participating children stood at the front of the attendees and led with their own prayers, then shared with us the importance of helping others and gave us their own examples. We were encouraged to help both people close to us and strangers, for through helping others you may also find an abundance of your own.

Ash Wednesday thoughts and prayers.

The Christian season of Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday.**The date of Ash Wednesday varies each year depending on the date of Easter. It is always six-and-a-half weeks before Easter. It can be as early as the 4th February and the latest possible date is the 10th March. **This year it is on the 5th March.**

Traditionally on Ash Wednesday the palm leaves and crosses saved from last year's Palm Sunday are burnt into grey ashes. They are then smeared in the shape of a cross on the foreheads of Christian people. At this point, their season of Lent begins.

We are not having an Ash Wednesday service at Christ Church this year but you may wish to begin your personal journey through Lent with the prayer below.

The Prayer of St. Ephrem the Syrian

"O Lord and Master of my life, keep from me the spirit of indifference and discouragement, lust for power, and idle chatter.
Instead, grant to me, your servant, the spirit of wholeness of being, humble-mindedness, patience, and love.
O Lord and King, grant me the grace to be aware of my sins and not to judge my brother; for you are blessed now and ever and forever". Amen.

It is a prayer for self-awareness and of awareness of our brothers and sisters, a day for restoring good and balanced relationships with those around us.

As we move through Lent let us deepen our awareness of how we interact with others and what we can do to bring grace and healing to them and to our world.
