Northern Devon Foodbank:

There are official Foodbank Centres in Barnstaple, Bideford, Braunton, Holsworthy, Ilfracombe, South Molton (plus a new centre at St Peter's Church Hall) Fremington. The foodbanks operate using a voucher referral system. See: www.northerndevon.foodbank.org.uk Christ Church has regularly supported the Foodbank, especially at harvest time. There is also a box in the foyer where donations of food (and other essentials) may be left – though many people give through collection points in supermarkets and other shops.

Ongoing needs, especially with families in mind, include: Tinned vegetables, meat, fish and soup; cooking sauces; longlife milk and fruit juice; tinned fruit, rice pudding, custard; jams and spreads.

Christian Aid Week:

The Big Brekkie raised £302.25. A great, happy event, supported by a good number of folk from the church and Hobnob, friends and family. It was good to welcome Ian Roome MP. Many thanks to all involved.
