# A resume of what happened on the Away Day

## Our opening act of worship included these readings:

**Acts 2 v 1-4:** "When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them."

**Reflection:** What can this mean for us? What happened on that first day of Pentecost affirms not that we human beings have to invest in some divine plan, but rather that God has invested in us. God promises to empower each one of us here today and to empower our Churches in North Devon along with the whole Church worldwide. All are included. The Holy Spirit doesn't speak solely through church leaders. The story of Pentecost reminds us that God speaks and acts powerfully through the likes of you and me, in any place, at any moment, and even when we're least expecting it.

Then we heard words of Paul to the Galatians, a church community which was struggling a bit at the time and then words of Jesus to Nicodemus who was struggling with his own personal faith.

**Galatians 2 v 22-25:** "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit".

**John 3 v 5-8:** "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. <sup>6</sup> Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."

## In our afternoon act of worship, we sang the hymns:

O Lord, My God when I in awesome wonder by Stuart K. Hine

We are marching in the light of God (South African Traditional),

The Lord's my shepherd by Stuart Townsend

Great is thy faithfulness, O God my Father by Thomas O. Chisholm.

The day was led by Deacon Ruth Richey, Mission Area Lead (North) for the South West Peninsula District of the Methodist Church. Deacon Joan Cole joined Ruth to help tell us about the history of Deaconesses in the Methodist Church and the role of Deacons in the church today. I found the explanations very helpful in understanding about these Ministers who are dedicated to a life of Prayer, Witness and Service. The Methodist Diaconal Order is "a Christ-centred, prayerful, pioneering Religious Order committed to modelling God's love in action".



Deacon Ruth called on us all to 'Embrace the Future'

We need to remember that God is always with us.

We spent the day café style in small groups around tables with paper tablecloths. We were asked to write down what our Church does currently – and then think WHY we do these activities. Then we were challenged to think about their purpose going forward. Ruth said it was a bit like gardening: you look at your garden and think how it could be improved – take some plants out or move them around, or plant new ones to make the garden grow better. It was thought-provoking and challenging but also a time of love and teamwork. Everyone took part and we learned more about each other.

Rev Marilyn typed up what we wrote on our tablecloths. She and I have also tried to put what we wrote into some sort of order to make it a bit easier to think about. Let's start with what we do in both Christ Church but also thinking of the other Circuit events:

In the afternoon, after a delicious lunch, we gathered around a large tree that Ruth had drawn. This was the focal point of our afternoon worship. Finally, we were invited to add a personal word or phrase to summarise how we felt because of the day.

## This is what Dot said of her experience at the Away Day:

"Our first session was entitled: What do you think goes on at our Church. As we made our lists, we realised just how many activities we partake in, ranging from different Church services, e.g. Causeway, Oasis, Cafe Church to Concerts, Coffee Mornings, Choir Practices, the list went on and on. We were asked to evaluate whether all these activities were of help to the Church, or were they a drain on resources, but the discussion was useful in that it made it clear how much we do achieve.

The second session was entitled: What else should we be offering. There followed a very good discussion, with suggestions of what we could aspire to, some impractical, and some worthy of further consideration.

At the end of a long morning session, we partook of an excellent lunch, and then several of us went for a walk along the seafront, enjoying the sunshine and a chat. We then had time to look at examples of different craftworks which had been brought in by many attendees. The skills of so many were outstanding and just shows what hidden talent we have in our Church.

After lunch Deacon Ruth displayed the outline of a large tree and asked everyone to contribute words to describe what had brought them to faith, what had contributed to our growth as a Church, and the positives and negatives in our Church at the moment. The words were written in the appropriate places.

It was so good to meet as a group and have ideas and suggestions flowing backwards and forwards between us. I felt inspired and uplifted by the whole day and feel huge gratitude to everyone who helped to plan and organise such a wonderful day."

## What happened next?

As you may be aware (or even attended) there was a meeting at this Church open to all who had an interest in the church. Thie was part of the Ilfracombe & Barnstaple Circuit Church Reviews The meeting, led by Reverend Tracey Darling and Deacon Rith Richey, was held on the morning of 23 July and was attended by a cross section of church members and friends.

In her introduction, Ruth referred back to the Away Day and said that the purpose of the meeting was to continue the conversation that we had started of our own volition but that the Review is part of something bigger. The aim was to:

- gain a comprehensive understanding of the current state and activities of the church;
- to provide time for reflection on the local context, mission, and God's work within the church;
- evaluate the practical aspects of being a church; and
- discern the ongoing work and understand what God is currently asking of the church in its mission within the local community.

The same format and questions have been applied to each church in the circuit and extensive notes were made and compiled. A draft summary was sent out a few weeks ago for us to present to Church Meeting and approve with or without amendment.

I attended the meeting and have seen the notes and summary so, hopefully, I can give an accurate summary here. I didn't count but I reckon there were around 20 people in attendance and that's not bad when you think our current membership stands at 55.

The opening worship centred around Hebrews Chapters 10 and 11 where we are told that faith is the assurance of things hopeful and not seen. You may remember that a series of questions were circulated, and we went through them in turn.

There were similarities with the approach taken for the Away Day in that we considered: what brings us joy in Christ Church; what is challenging and what things are draining us rather than being life-giving; what missional activities are we engaged in; how do we sustain and nurture our discipleship and faith; what growth has there been in the last 5 years and what are our hopes for the future? Many of the comments made mirrored what had been written on the Away Day Tree.

There was also a bit of pragmatic stuff like how big is our membership (55), do we have a balanced budget (no but we can pay our assessment for the next 2 years), what sort of state is our property in (fair); are there issues over roles and responsibilities (comments made were that we need a health and safety officer, a church administrator and another treasurer so that Kathy can step down. We were also asked to consider what help we wanted from District and the URC Synod – remember that we are a joint Methodist/URC and there is money available in both.

# Finally, we were asked "what do you sense God is saying to Christ Church Barnstaple?" These were the responses recorded by Ruth:

- Listen to me, listen to Jesus we need to pray.
- Discern where God is leading.
- Trust me and each other. Take risks, I will be there for you.
- Invite people to special services (e.g. Brownies)
- Accept change and move forward.
- Move on holding his hand.
- You're not alone and you're part of something bigger.
- Be encouraged, change and celebrate.

In our "wash-up" meeting from the Away Day we agreed we should send round some sort of summary for everyone to read. It was also opportune that we had this Review in July as well.

We hope this "special edition" will provide food for thought for all associated with Christ Church Barnstaple and will give Sheralee an idea of how we think at present. I am sure you, like me, are excited about her imminent arrival and look forward to all that she brings.

Prayer plays a big part in our Church life, so I am closing with:
